though the wonders of ancient roman culture continue to attract interest across the disciplines it is difficult to find a lively accessible collection of the full range of the era s literature in english the oxford anthology of roman literature provides a general introduction to the literature of the roman empire at its zenith between the second century bc and the second century ad two features of this extraordinarily fertile period in literary achievement as evidenced by this anthology are immediately and repeatedly clear how similar the romans view of the world was to our own and perhaps even more obviously how different it was most of the authors included in the anthology wrote in latin but as the anthology moves forward in time relevant greek texts that reflect the cultural diversity of roman literary life are also included

something no other such anthology has done in the past roman literature was wonderfully creative and diverse and the texts in this volume were chosen from a broad range of genres drama epic philosophy satire lyric poetry love poetry by its very nature an anthology can abbreviate and thus obscure the most attractive features of even a masterpiece so the two editors have not only selected texts that capture the essence of the respective authors but also have included accompanying introductions and afterwords that will guide the reader in pursuing further reading the presentations of the selections are enlivened with illustrations that locate the works within the contexts of the world in which they were written and enjoyed the student and general reader will come away from this learned yet entertaining anthology with a fuller appreciation of the place occupied by literature in the roman world

excerpt from an anthology of german literature this book is designed to accompany an introductory study of the history of german literature it is assumed that the history itself will be learned so far as may be necessary either from lectures or from some other book devoted to the subject i have tried to make a good anthology for students who have learned to read the language of goethe and schiller with some facility and would like to know something of the earlier periods but have not studied and may not care to study old and middle german on this account the selections in part first are given in modern german translations the original texts are omitted because space was very precious and the book was intended as an aid to literary rather than linguistic study in making the selections my first principle was to give a good deal of the best rather than a little of everything i wished to make friends for medieval german poetry and it seemed to me that this could best be done by showing it in its strength and its beauty so i have ignored much that might have had a historical or linguistic interest for the scholar and have steadily applied the criterion of literary worth about the publisher forgotten books publishes hundreds of thousands of rare and classic books find more at forgottenbooks.com this book is a reproduction of an important historical work forgotten books uses state of the art technology to digitally reconstruct the work preserving the original format whilst repairing imperfections present in the aged copy in rare cases an imperfection in the original such as a blemish or missing page may be replicated in our edition we do however repair the vast majority of imperfections successfully any imperfections that remain are intentionally left to preserve the state of such historical works

this volume is devoted to plays and prose writings the task of bringing together samples of the best of modern indian writing is now complete the translations have been done by a competent team and are sure to appeal to lovers of literature

this book tests critical reassessments of us radical writing of the 1930s against recent developments in theories of modernism and the avant garde multidisciplinary in approach it considers poetry fiction classical music commercial art jazz and popular contests such as dance marathons and bingo relating close readings to social and economic contexts over the period 1856 1952 it centers in on a key author or text in each chapter providing an unfolding chronological narrative while at the same time offering nuanced updates on existing debates part one focuses on the roots of the 1930s proletarian movement in poetry and music of the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries part two analyzes the output of proletarian novelists considered alongside contemporaneous works by established modernist authors as well as more mainstream popular titles

though canon concerns seem to be a relic of 1990s academia we are once again at a historical moment when there is resistance to teaching texts by writers of color and texts that deal with race ethnicity and gender at the same time algorithmic bias scholars are locating systemic bias encoded into systems from policing software to housing software bringing these divergent areas together amy e earhart examines how technological and institutional infrastructures construct and deconstruct race ethnicity and gender identities focusing on two central infrastructures the database a commonly used technological infrastructure in the digital humanities and the anthology a scholarly and pedagogical infrastructure earhart considers how such seemingly naturalized infrastructures impact the representation and modeling of identity the book draws upon the building and use of dala a collection of almost 100 years of generalist american and african american literature anthologies constructed to investigate questions of identity and representation in literary anthologies and by extension the larger literary canon the resulting examination and its rigorous discussion of how identities are created and recreated within black literary histories has important implications for contemporary cultural and political debates about canon formation literary scholarship and the bias embedded in technological infrastructures

this concise broadview anthology of primary source materials is unique in its focus on romantic literature and the ways in which the period itself was characterized by wide ranging self conscious debates about the meaning of literature it includes materials that are not available in other romantic literature anthologies the anthology is organized into thirteen sections that highlight the intensity and sophistication with

which a variety of related literary issues were debated in the romantic period these debates posed fundamental questions about the very nature of literature as a cultural phenomenon the extent and role of the reading public literature's relation to the sciences and the aesthetic the influence of contemporary commercial pressures and the impact of perceived excesses in consumer fashions the anthology foregrounds the ways that these literary debates converged with broader social and political controversies such as the french revolution the struggle for women's rights colonialism and the anti slave trade campaign this anthology includes an impressive range of writings from the period including literary criticism and philosophical political scientific and travel writing which embodies the collection's broad approach to romantic literature both lesser known and more canonical writings are included and the selections are organized by topic in such a way as to dramatize the debates and exchanges which characterize the romantic period

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
